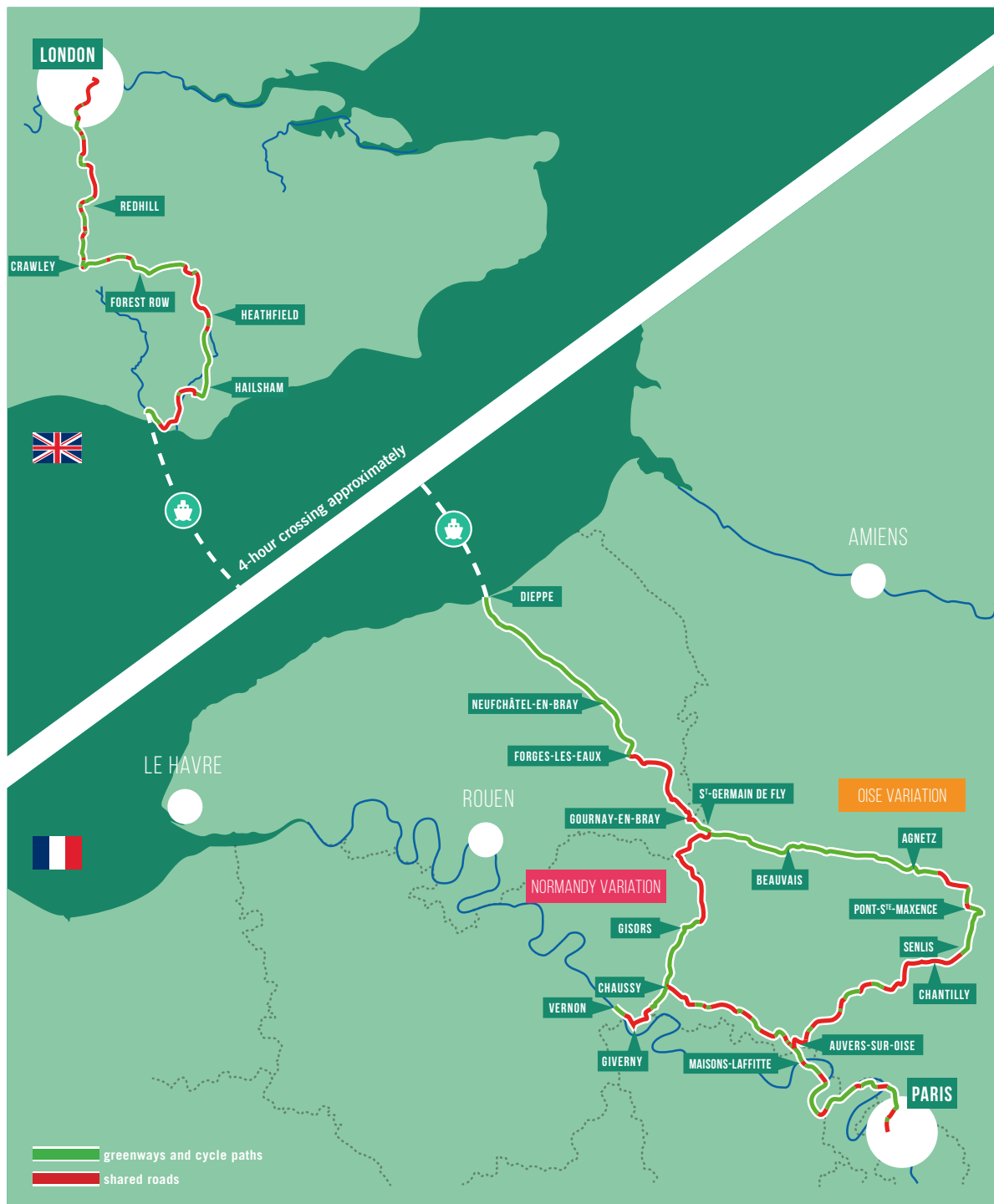

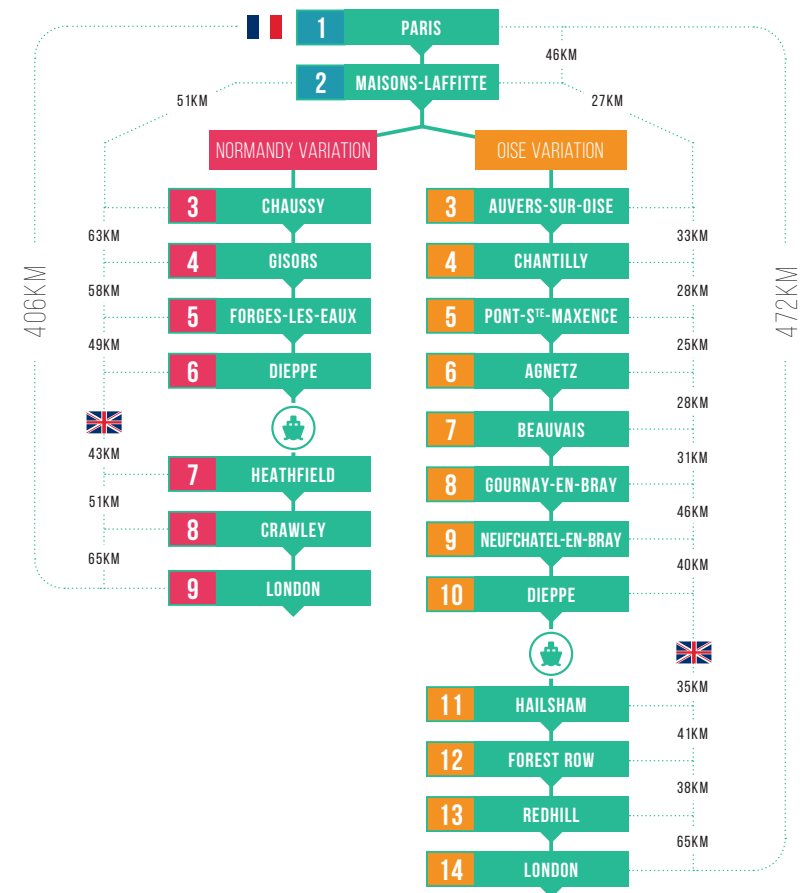


THE ROUTE

The Avenue Verte London-Paris® is a cycle route which will encourage you to spend time exploring charming hidden corners of France and Great Britain, with the added pleasure of unexpected encounters along the way. It's a journey which gives you the chance to immerse yourself in the urban environment just as much as in the natural world – many of the landscapes you traverse offer their local flavours with the colourful spectacle of fields, forests, lakes and coastal scenery.

Two variations are available on your route from Paris to London, either via the banks of the Oise river (Picardy – 472km / 295miles) or following the Epte valley (Normandy – 406km / 254 miles).

On the French side, you will recognise the landscapes in the valley of the Seine which inspired the Impressionist painters, you will pass through the protected natural landscape of the Regional Natural Park of French Vexin, you will discover the manor houses, châteaux and abbeys of the Epte and Oise valleys, you will savour the gastronomic delights of the Bray region and admire the impressive cliffs along the Alabaster Coast. On the English side, you will travel through the southern counties praised by the poets before reaching the tumult of London and the Thames.





GENERAL INFORMATION

This brochure gives a description of each stage with the main places to visit, a selection of establishments chosen for the quality of their services for cyclists: addresses of accommodation, restaurants, bicycle renters and repairers, and all sorts of other useful information such as distances, gradients, and road surfaces.

These information sheets are aimed primarily at a clientele from commercial operators: individuals looking for a break of a week to 10 days, combining cycling with the discovery of cultural, historical or gastronomic heritage. DIFFICULTY OF THE ROUTE AND ROAD SURFACES



The Avenue verte London-Paris® is generally flat and over 50% of it is on greenways (often on old railway lines). There are occasional inclines particularly in Vexin and the department of Eure in France.

All terrain road bikes are the most suitable for the route, which has varied surfaces (tarmac, sand or compacted gravel on the greenways, etc.)

TRAIN + BIKE

The train is a practical and fast option if you want to skip stages in the route. Departing from Paris, the RER line A or D (Chantilly, Creil) and many suburban transilien and TER lines (Paris St-Lazare and Gare du Nord stations), offer free parking for bikes and serve several stations along the route: Saint-Denis, Chatou, Saint-Germain-en-Laye, Maisons-Laffitte, Conflans-Sainte-Honorine, Cergy-Pontoise, Vernon-Giverny, Serqueux, Dieppe. In England the route also passes several station along its way: Brighton, Newhaven, Eastbourne (via Polegate), Tunbridge Wells, East Grinstead, Crawley, Gatwick Airport, Wimbledon, and various stations in London.



Your return journey can be arranged from Saint-Pancras station in London (Eurostar).

CROSSING THE CHANNEL BY FERRY

The crossing between Dieppe and Newhaven is run by Transmanche Ferries. Both their ferries 'Le Côte d'Albâtre' and the 'Seven Sisters' are fitted with stabilisers to make your journey more comfortable. There is plenty of seating so that you can enjoy a sea view during the 4-hour crossing. You will also find a bar on board, as well as food, games for children and adults, a shop and lounges where you can relax, and even cabins for those who feel tired and want to sleep.

Be they providers of accommodation, restaurants, bicycle renters or repairers, managers of tourist attractions, or tourist offices, they are all located within 5 km of the l'Avenue Verte London-Paris® route and have been trained to adapt their reception to the needs of cycle tourists, whether they are passing through or staying in the area.

Note: 'Accueil Vélo' accommodation can sometimes transfer luggage to your next place of stay as well as prepare packed lunches.

STAGE 1

PARIS AND THE SURROUNDINGS

Welcome to Paris, the City of Light! After visiting at your own pace the monuments of the capital, you will be ready to reach London!

From the zero point of the highways of France, on the forecourt of Notre-Dame cathedral, you will discover through shared routes and greenways the districts of Paris, then the bucolic banks of the Canal Saint-Martin. You will leave Paris gently along the Saint-Denis canal to reach the Seine river.



The information sheet for this first stage is an invitation to spend some time looking around Paris and its surrounding area before you leave for London. Here we give details of some specially selected places in the French capital where you can have a good time, spend the night or have a nice meal.

THE HIGHLIGHTS



Notre-Dame cathedral and the Saint-Martin canal / Paris

Notre-Dame cathedral is the most well-known in France. Occupying a site on the île de la Cité, between 2 branches of the Seine, it lies in the historic heart of Paris. No visit of the cathedral since the burning (until 2024 or 2025) but many iconic sites are much frequented: le Pont Neuf, le pont de l'Archevêché. Close by, the Saint-Martin canal is ideal for a stroll along its shady banks or a browse in the plethora of colourful shops along the quayside. The Saint-Denis canal and Street Art Avenue / Saint-Denis

Seine Saint-Denis and the North east of Paris are places full of creativity, especially as far as urban art is concerned. Many internationally renowned artists embellish the walls of the Plaine Commune area with their works of street art. Realising this, the idea came of creating Street Art Avenue along the Saint-Denis canal, from the Porte de la Villette to Saint-Denis railway station.

Saint-Denis Basilica Cathedral / near Paris

Located on the edge of Paris, the basilica cathedral designed by Abbot Suger in the 12th century was the first gothic masterpiece. Built upon the tomb of Saint-Denis and enlarged over the centuries, the basilica became the royal necropolis from the 6th century, so it now has a collection of over 70 royal sculpted tombs unique in Europe. You can spot this impressive monument once you arrive at the Saint-Denis canal. It disappears once more into the landscape to reappear when you reach the Stade de France.

STAGE 2

PARIS > MAISONS-LAFFITTE

After crossing the Gennevilliers Port, the largest river port in Ile-de-France, the bike trail follows a pedestrian promenade along the banks of the Seine. Along a series of islands and parks, you will discover the landscapes that inspired the impressionist painters. The Seine will then guide you to Maisons-Laffitte. On the way, consider a stop at Saint-Germain-en-Laye to visit the former residence of the rings of France and its park designed by the renowned landscaper André Le Nôtre.

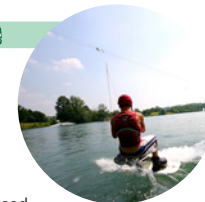

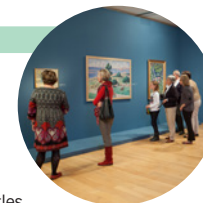

STAGE 5

NORMANDY
VARIATION

GISORS > FORGES-LES-EAUX

After leaving Gisors the route climbs up the Epte Valley between the wooded hills of Norman Vexin and the Picardy plain. The lanes which you take then lead you into the Brayons District. Be bold and climb to the top of Sainte-Hélène hill to admire the unusual so-called 'buttonhole' geography of the Bray region, which you will cross next.

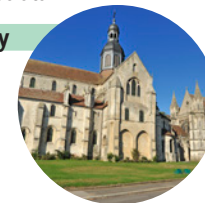
THE HIGHLIGHTS

The Saint-Pierres-es-Champs Ecological Réserve / Saint-Pierre-es-Champs

A wonderful natural setting well-known for its old lime tree, protected orchids and butterflies. A path leads to the top of the Côte-Sainte-Hélène where you can take advantage of the breathtaking view. Ceramic viewing table and calvary were designed by two local artists just like the sculpture of the hermit who lived there. To see on the road! Set off to explore the peat marshes! A nature trail with interpretive panels, provides visitors access to this Natura 2000 site.

The Abbey Church and Sainte Chapelle / Saint-Germer-de-Fly

Although it doesn't attain the same dimensions as the great cathedrals, the 12th century abbey church still has its place amongst the masterpieces of early gothic art due to its elevation to four floors and the decoration ornamenting the choir linked to the central nave.



The Resistance and Deportation Museum Forges-les-Eaux

With two floors, this museum retraces the dark years of the Second World War in the Bray area with a multitude of period objects and documents (weapons and uniforms, aviation equipment, posters and the like). Numerous eyewitness accounts from resistance fighters and deportees

Gatwick International Airport

The UK's second biggest airport sees more than 40 million passengers flying off to over two hundred destinations worldwide. The proximity of the 'Avenue Verte London-Paris' is maybe surprising as we travel for several miles beneath the aeroplanes flying over our heads as they take off and land.

The parks of Greater London

Royal Parks or simple common land, the parks are in fact the green lungs of the London conurbation. The eight royal parks, like Hyde Park, Regent's Park or Kensington Garden, are indeed extraordinary. The biggest and certainly the most amazing is Richmond Park. Crossed by the Thames cycle route, the NCN4, this park, close to central London, is listed as a national nature reserve and has been home to a population of deer for over three hundred years.



Tower Bridge / London

Opposite the Tower of London where the royal jewels are kept, the iconic Tower Bridge has stood over the Thames since 1894. This lifting bridge is 268 metres long with two neo-gothic towers as supports. Tower Bridge is indubitably one of the symbolic monuments of the British capital.

Big Ben / London

Big Ben is the nickname given to the bell in the clock tower of the palace of Westminster, where you will find the Houses of Parliament. This 96-metre-high tower, built between 1858 and 1859 on the banks of the Thames, is without doubt the most famous clock in the world. It's also the arrival (or departure) point for the Avenue Verte London-Paris..

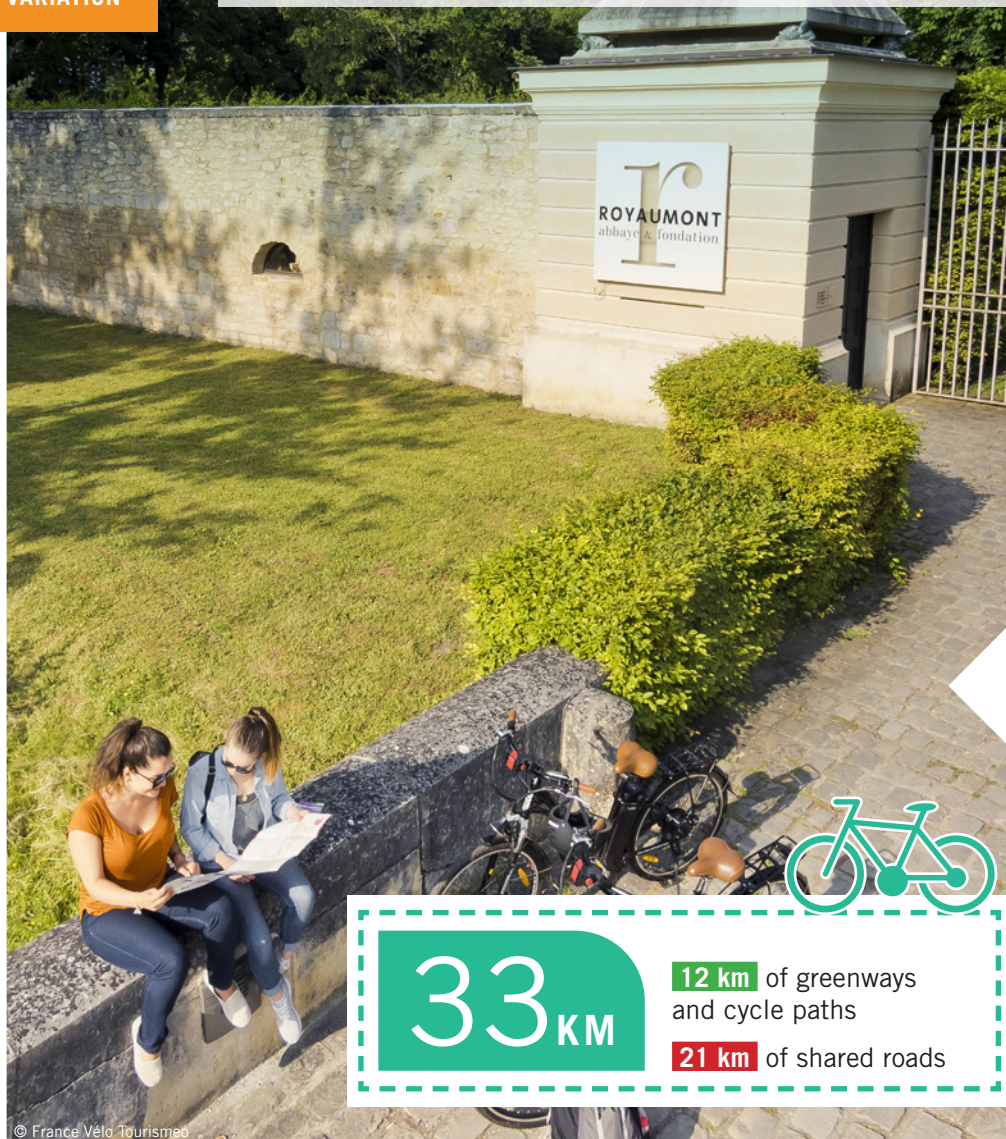

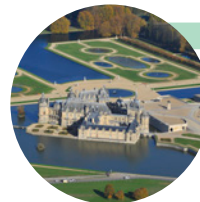

Covering 2,837 hectares, the forest comprises principally beech and oak, including several "Remarkable Trees", with numerous marked trails and a botanical path.

Beginning in the late 19th century, the painters Renoir, Monet and Pissarro, not to mention Degas, Boudin and Blanche enjoyed staying in the Dieppe region. A few of their greatest masterpieces were inspired by the quality of the light and the region's striking landscapes. Permanent tourist information panels set up in the town of Dieppe, in the same exact locations where the painters set up their easels, allow you to journey back in time.



Dieppe Castle-Museum

Perched atop a cliff with a fine view of the seafront and the town, the castle-museum has an encyclopaedic collection retracing the history of the town of Dieppe and its maritime heritage. In this medieval building, you will find rooms on a nautical theme displaying models of ships, maps, navigation instruments, paintings and engravings, and furniture, all giving you a glimpse of the past.

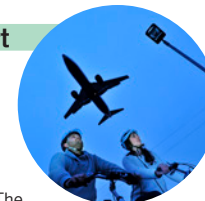


Worth Way / East Grinstead

The parks of Greater London

Royal Parks or simple common land, the parks are in fact the green lungs of the London conurbation. The eight royal parks, like Hyde Park, Regent's Park or Kensington Garden, are indeed extraordinary. The biggest and certainly the most amazing is Richmond Park. Crossed by the Thames cycle route, the NCN4, this park, close to central London, is listed as a national nature reserve and has been home to a population of deer for over three hundred years.

Tower Bridge / London

Opposite the Tower of London where the royal jewels are kept, the iconic Tower Bridge has stood over the Thames since 1894. This lifting bridge is 268 metres long with two neo-gothic towers as supports. Tower Bridge is indubitably one of the symbolic monuments of the British capital.



Big Ben / London

Big Ben is the nickname given to the bell in the clock tower of the palace of Westminster, where you will find the Houses of Parliament.

This 96-metre-high tower, built between 1858 and 1859 on the banks of the Thames, is without doubt the most famous clock in the world. It's also the arrival (or departure) point for the Avenue Verte London-Paris.
